



TENSILE MEMBRANE

STUDY FOR SEASONAL HOUSING

The fuzz is engineered for friction coefficient, a textile of micro-hairs calibrated to repel droplets while admitting certain wavelengths of light. Beneath: a biopolymer shell that yellows according to schedule, stress-tested against gravity's incremental demands.

Consider the blush—not ornament but thermal sugar concentration rendered visible, a gradient from pale to incarnadine that signals readiness for disassembly.

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We have not solved this—the way it knows to soften from stone outward, how the seam pre-scores itself, a perforation for the hand's convenience. Our prototypes split randomly, or not at all.

In cross-section; the architecture of yield, designed for obsolescence, for a single user who will discard the housing and remember only the glucose burst, the juice on the chin—the function, never the form that made it possible.
